# Daisy Day Cozies

#### **Pattern Notes:**

Gauge is somewhat important so your cozy fits an actual can! Different yarn weights - even if they all say worsted weight can vary in thickness which can vary the size of your cozy when it comes to length. Can cozy knit in the round. Due to the nature of knitting in the round and carrying two colors, with this chart, at times you're carrying yarn for several stitches. You'll want to twist your yarn after 3-4 stitches so the floats aren't all loosey-goosey! The yellow in the center of the daisy was worked with duplicate stitch.

#### **Materials:**

US 6/4.0 mm, DPN or appropriate length cable needle, tapestry needle, stitch marker if needed for beginning of row, Yarn: You can use any worsted weight in desired colors, tapestry needle.

#### Gauge:

17.5 sts + 27 rows = 4 inches/10 centimeters in stockinette stitch, finished can cozie will measure around  $5^{\circ}x4.5^{\circ}$ 

#### Skills needed:

Knitting in the round, increasing, duplicate stitch

#### **Abbreviations:**

CO: Cast On; K: Knit; K1: Knit one; K1fb: Knit one stitch in the front and back of the same stitch, creating an increase; P1: Purl one, BO: Bind off

# **Can Cozy**

#### **DPN** instructions:

With MC (or Mint like example used), CO 12, divide evenly on 3 needles, join in round, place marker to indicate first stitch or needle, however you want to keep track of your rows – Your cozy will have a small hole in the bottom

row 1: K

row 2: \*K1, K1fb, K1fb, K1\* Repeat this per needle (18 stitches)

row 3: K

row 4: \*K1, K1fb, K to last 2 stitches, K1fb, K1 \* repeat this per needle (24 stitches)

row 5: K

row 6: repeat row 4 (30 stitches)

row 7: K

row 8: repeat row 4 (36 stitches)

### **Magic Loop instructions:**

With MC (or Mint, like the example used), CO 12, join in the round, placing a marker to indicate first stitch, however you want to keep track of your rows – Your cozy will have a small hole in the bottom row 1: K

row 2: K1, K1fb, K1fb, K1, repeat this two times more (18 stitches)

row 3: K

row 4: K1, K1fb, K2, K1fb, K1, repeat this two times more (24 stitches)

row 5: K

row 6: K1, K1fb, K4, K1fb, K1, repeat this two times more (30 stitches)

row 7: K

row 8: K1, K1fb, K6, K1fb, K1, repeat this two times more (36 stitches)

## Can cozie continued:


Body of cozy starts row 1 row 1-21: work chart row 22: \*K1, P1\* from star to star row 23: \*K1, P1\* from star to star row 24: BO

Duplicate stitch in the centers of the daisies using chart below.

Weave in the ends, or don't. No judgment from me!
